EFFECTS OF ATOMIC RADIATION

Letter dated 6 May 1974 from the President of the General Assembly  
addressed to the Secretary-General

In paragraph 1 of resolution 3154 C (XXVIII) of 14 December 1973, the General Assembly decided to increase the membership of the United Nations Scientific Committee on the Effects of Atomic Radiation to a maximum of 20 members. In paragraph 2 of the same resolution, the General Assembly decided that, in the event that more than five Governments informed the President of the Assembly of their desire to become part of the Scientific Committee, the selection of the new members of the Committee would be decided by the President of the Assembly, in consultation with the Chairmen of the regional groups, on the basis of an equitable geographical distribution.

I have the honour to inform you that, having held the consultations provided for in paragraph 2 of the resolution, I have appointed the following States members of the Committee: Germany (Federal Republic of), Indonesia, Peru, Poland and Sudan.
